









Safety Signage

Safety signage is important because it informs users of danger, safety issues and other relevant information. The signs reproduced on this page are only some of the Australian Standards signs for beach safety. The signs here are provided in full colour to support teachers in delivering Activities S2 and S5.

			
<p>Dangerous current – strong current or rip present</p>	<p>Rough surf</p>		
			
<p>Dangerous stingers – jellyfish or other stingers may be in water</p>	<p>Shallow water</p>		
			
<p>Red and yellow flags – surf lifesavers patrol the area</p>	<p>No swimming – dangerous beach or surf conditions</p>	<p>Standard signage can be presented in a format such as these to provide one information point. Signs like these most often appear in car parks to provide information on the appropriateness of the beach.</p>
